

I am delighted to have Mrs Elaine Leigh as our thoroughly proficient classroom assistant. She has made my transition a lot easier since I joined and I know she will provide invaluable assistance to the children as we progress through the year. I have no doubt that your children will grow to appreciate just how much her hard work will matter.

Work....

There is a lot! As you are aware your children will be taking their SATs in May. To prepare them we do give them opportunities to complete practice papers as this familiarises them with the format of the SATs and also highlights areas that we need to focus on. When the SATs come around we all want the children to feel relaxed, rested and prepared. All handwriting is expected to be fluent and joined with pencil or pen. If you need some handwriting sheets in order for your children to practise handwriting at home then please ask. We will be having handwriting practice in school. Children may have to do their SATs in pen this year so if you would like to invest in a nice blue handwriting pen then please do.

Everything else your child will need to learn in school will be provided. Children do not need to bring in big pencil cases of their own or large bags to carry things in but if your child would like their own felt-tips and colours then they can keep those in their school bags just outside the classroom.

Homework

This will usually consist of numeracy, literacy, topic and research tasks. Ordinarily, homework should take about 30 minutes per subject to complete. Children will be bringing spellings home that they have had corrected in their class work. Homework will be handed out on a Friday and is expected to be returned the following Friday. If your children find any of the homework set too much of a challenge please do not allow them to get worried or upset about it. Instead we would much prefer them to come into school the next day and speaks to either Mrs Leigh or me. This way we can give them the guidance they need in order to complete it. However as you will understand this needs to be done BEFORE the hand-in day, so we ask you to encourage them to do their homework sooner rather than later. Failure to hand in expected homework will result in your child missing their lunch-play in order to do it.

From time to time, your children may also bring home school work that they have not managed to complete in class. Keeping these systems in place ensures that your children will be making the most out of their time in Year 6 and that the other children feel fairly and consistently treated. The children have also been reminded that they should be reading every day for at least 10 minutes and they have been supplied with reading diaries in order to record this. If possible try to hear your child read as reading out-loud will improve their ability to read punctuation and add expression. Also, please encourage your children to talk about what they read as comprehension skills are an enormous part of Year 6.

And finally...I feel confident that we are all launching into this important year with exactly the right attitude. As teaching staff we only ever want the very best for your children and part of my teaching philosophy is that happy children learn best. Please help me and the school to make this a constant priority.
