Medicine in school

In accordance with the Department of Education's Health & Safety guidance school staff are not required to administer medicines to pupils unless they have been **prescribed by a GP**.

In some cases, written instructions from the parent or on the medication container dispensed by the pharmacist may be considered sufficient.

If your child needs medication during the school day then you need to complete a medical form from the school office. This medicine will be sent home at the end of each day, as we cannot keep medicines on school premises indefinitely.

If your child has a condition that requires regular or immediate medication, please discuss setting up a Health Plan with our SENCO.

Please pop into the school office to collect any medicines you may have stored here. Any uncollected medicines will be safely disposed of during half term.

Breakfast Club

We run a daily Breakfast Club from 7:45am in the school hall. Children are welcome to attend without prior booking.

The cost for breakfast; a choice of cereals, pancakes, fruit and a selection of drinks, is ± 2.50 a session. For supervision only, without breakfast, the cost is ± 1.50 a session.

Payment will be via our online payment system at the end of each half term, unless you have paid cash directly to Mrs Buckley.
