

Enrichment Week - Shang Dynasty

We held our Shang Dynasty and China Enrichment Week this week in school. The children all enjoyed a session of extremely calming Tai Chi Qigong on Monday, courtesy of Beith Woodburn and Tai Chi for Health. On Tuesday and Thursday the kitchen provided a spread of Chinese food for the children to enjoy and on Thursday morning the children in Key Stage 1 had a go at Chinese dance with Sarah Henderson. In classes the children made Chinese dragons, shadow puppets and Chinese lanterns. They learnt about the achievements of the Shang Dynasty and about life in China in general 3500 years ago. The children even had a go at a traditional Chinese game – Pong hau k'i. If you would like to play the game yourselves you can do so by drawing a game board like the one below (left) and placing four counters of two colours in each corner (see right). Each player takes a turn to move into a space.
