WRAP AROUND CARE

Breakfast Club

- Runs from 7:30 8:30am every day
- For breakfast we provide cereal and toast. Squash and milk is also available.

Pricing

- £3.50 breakfast included (served until 8:10am)
- £2.50 supervision-only from 7.30am
- £2 supervision only from 8am
- You can pre-book and pay online.
 Equally you can drop off on the day without booking

Afterschool Club

- Runs from 3:15 6:00pm every day
- A snack of crackers, wraps and rice cakes with various fillings and toppings is offered, plus drinks and fruit. We can also cater for other dietary requirements.

Pricing

- 3:15 4:15pm £5.50
 4:15 6:00pm (after extra-curricular club) £7
 3:15 6:00pm £9
- You will need to pre book and pay online

<u>UNIFORM</u>





- White polo-shirt, blouse or shirt (plain)
- Navy-blue cardigan or jumper
- Grey trousers, skirt or pinafore
- Navy skirt or pinafore is also acceptable
- Blue checked dress for summer months
- Grey, navy or black socks / tights
- Plain black school shoes (trainers are acceptable if of leather type construction with no visible logos etc)
- Navy book bag
- PE school shorts (navy) or a skort, school T-shirt (light blue), black trainers
- Our sweatshirts, polo shirts, PE kit and book bags, with our personalised school logo, can be purchased through our local supplier, Tor Printing (link on our website under parents tab / uniform). The only item of clothing we insist on a logo is a sweatshirt.

SCHOOL MEALS



- School dinner is free for all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2.
 You will need to book online.
- Online booking you can do this from the first Monday in July (for meals).
- Fruit is provided in school for snack
- School Milk for under 5s is free if you would like school milk to continue after your child's 5th birthday, then you will need to contact the supplier directly. Google 'Cool Milk'



Things to bring to school

- A water bottle
- Book bag (no need for a rucksack in Reception)
- Sun hat
- Woollen hat, scarf, gloves
- A coat (essential)
- Wellies
- We request that children do not bring toys from home as this can lead to upsets


