As the half term holiday approaches, I'd like to reflect on some of the many things that we have done and achieved already so far this term. In the last five weeks Year 6 have had a wonderful residential to Osmington Bay, have completed their SATs and have started working on their production of the Lion King. They have also taken part in a debate at the Youth Parliament in Taunton. Year 5 children have attended the Cyder Barn care home for the first time and have had a taster day at Whitstone School. Year 4 children have had an Egyptian workshop from Somerset Heritage Service and Year 1 have visited Noah's Ark Zoo Farm Park. Year 2 completed their SATs and enjoyed a vicar workshop with Revd Chris Hopkins. Children from Year 1-6 have taken part in an engineering showcase at Haynes Motor Museum and have had the opportunity to watch the cricket at Taunton County Cricket around, and to take part in a Tri-Golf and a girls' cricket competitions.

We also supported Christian Aid and raised a respectable \pounds 78.15, which will go to support mothers in Sierra Leone.
