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Dear Parents/Carers,

This week we welcome Orlando to Hedgehog Class and Hugo to Otter Class – it has been lovely seeing how welcoming our children are when we have children join us mid-year. We hope both boys will be very happy here.

Over the coming weeks, I would like to give reminders about attendance. Any absence affects the pattern of a child's schooling and regular absence may seriously affect their learning. We want our pupils to attend school every day, unless they are really not well enough. We believe that children who attend school regularly are more likely to feel settled in school, maintain friendships, keep up with their learning and gain the greatest benefit from their education. Parents should try to make medical or dental appointments outside of school hours wherever possible. Where appointments during school time are unavoidable, the pupil should only be out of school for the minimum amount of time necessary for the appointment. It is not acceptable for a child to miss a whole day's schooling for an appointment, unless absolutely necessary, in which case the school will need an explanation as to why this is.

Finally a plea – please ensure that children have a coat in school every day. We do try to get the children outside for fresh air and children without a coat during very cold days or drizzly days will need to remain inside. Many thanks for your support with this.

First Aid Course

Congratulations to all of the year 6 children. They have successfully passed the Student First Aid course from St John's Ambulance and can now call themselves first aiders. The course consisted of age appropriate modules covering asthma, minor bleeding and bruising, choking, communication and casualty care, fainting, primary survey, shock, head injuries, recovery position, resuscitation (adult) and severe bleeding. Year 5 and year 3 will be completing an age appropriate course on the 21st November.
