
Devices



Forest School

Next weekend is the great RSPB big garden birdwatch. This is a fantastic opportunity to sit and see which birds visit your gardens. Signing up is free and you receive an information pack to record your sightings as well as a spotting guide.

This week I thought we could make bird feeders to encourage the birds into the garden. There are so many different ways to make bird feeders. The easiest is to buy some bird food and some lard/ coconut oil. Spread the lard onto some toilet roll or in a pine cone and then roll in the bird seed. Tie a piece of string on the top and hang up. You can even mix the bird food into the lard and put it into a cookie cutter and leave to harden. Then hang. Another suggestion is to thread plain popcorn onto some garden wire.

Have some fun and feed those birds.
