#### Dear Parents/Carers,

This week, the senior leadership team have been evaluating data from statutory assessments such as SATs. In our Reception Class, 75% of children achieved a 'Good Level of development' and the gap between boys' and girls' attainment has decreased meaning that boys are now more in-line with the girls' attainment. Previously, girls' attainment had been significantly higher than the boys. These results from the reception class are the best we have had since 2015. Following this success, 86% of children in Year 1 passed the phonics screening check. This is well above last year's national percentage and is a reflection of the hard work and systematic teaching from Mrs Robinson and her team. I have gone back as far as 2013 and this is the highest percentage we have achieved. Our Year 2 SATs also show successes – particularly the percentage of children achieving the higher standard. This year 39% of our Year 2 reached the higher standard in Reading; 26% in Maths and 19% in Writing. In addition to this, our Year 6 results came out this week: 94% of our children achieved the expected standard in reading compared to 75% nationally. We also had our highest ever percentage of children reaching the expected standard in grammar, punctuation and spelling. There were many individual successes and the children should be very proud of themselves. Once all of our data has been validated, then we will publish it on our website. Of course, primary education isn't just about results, the Year 6 children have been a credit to West Pennard and along with the Year 6 teaching team have worked extremely hard all year.

At this stage in the year, I would like to thank parents for all of their support, working in partnership with teachers and staff members to ensure we get the best personal and educational outcomes for all of the children at our school.
