The IT work was very much needed as our old IT system was not fit for purpose and the Wi-Fi would regularly cut out. Now that we have reliable Wi-Fi, the FWPS have agreed to support the school financially by paying for a set of Chromebooks which the children will be able to use in their classes. Having this 'portable' technology will mean that teachers can enhance lessons in so many more ways. We are really grateful to the FWPS for funding this. Finally, I would like to thank my staff for all of the fantastic opportunities and learning experiences that they organise for the children. Just in this week they have organised: cyclo-cross, cross-country, a range of after-school clubs, a visit from Josef Tucker, Year 2 have been to the SS Great Britain, Year R have visited the church, Year 6 had experts from the Heritage Trust to teach them hands on about life during WW2, there has been cookery and Year 5 have had a drumming workshop.
