The Strawberry Line

The Strawberry Line Path is an fantastic project aiming to create a continuous 30-mile traffic free path from Clevedon on the coast, across mid-Somerset to Shepton Mallet, and beyond. Wells, was once home to 3 railway stations and traces of the areas railway heritage can be found throughout the city and the surrounding countryside.

This is an approximately 3-mile circular walk, on largely traffic free paths, with just one modest hill. Park at Morrison's supermarket (3 hours free parking is allowed) or elsewhere in the city and follow the A371 Wells/Shepton Mallet road for a couple of hundred metres before the walk picks up the cutting of the former East Somerset Railway.

After a mile or so you'll reach the pretty village of Dulcote, carry on to the ornamental fountain before turning north and following the pavement to the foot of Constitution Hill with fantastic views all around.

Before ascending cross the road, following the Public Footpath sign, through a small gate where you'll see the town and Cathedral just half a mile or so away. Follow the path across what was once a deer park for the Bishops Palace to find yourself alongside the palace moat.


