

On Friday next week we will be in receipt of our traditional West Pennard Christmas tree which usually takes pride of place in the hall. As with all things this year, we have considered how we can do things differently, so we have decided to have a tree set in the grass outside of the Kitchen so that all can see it as they pass through the gate each morning. 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


