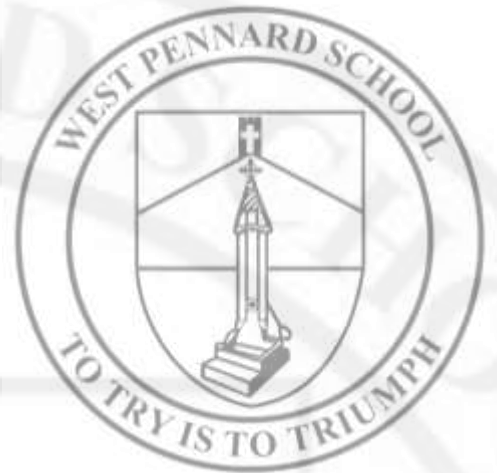

Here and There



Black Down / Beacon Batch is a great place for a family visit if you want to learn more about the history of our area and its people. Featuring bronze-age barrows, World War II defences including stumps to prevent enemy aircraft landing and remains of a decoy town to protect local people during air-raids.

There are opportunities to learn about soil erosion and understand more about how Ordnance Survey accurately mapped Britain long before GPS was available. The highest point on the Mendip Hills, on a clear day you can see for miles - even watch aircraft take off and land in the distance at Bristol Airport. On a cold autumn or wintery day the area is often covered in thick fog which makes for a very special atmosphere.

Parking at/by Tynings Trekking Centre, BS40 7XU. Wellies are recommend!



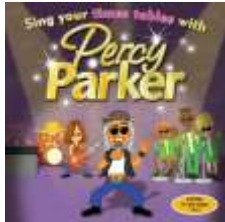
Avon Valley Adventure and Wildlife Park combines fun and education in one! Avon Valley is a place to meet animals of all shapes and sizes, including Highland cattle, Shetland ponies, pigs, goats, donkeys, alpaca, llama, red and fallow deer and more. Enjoy fun and adventure with the 1 & ½ mile Riverside Walk, outside play, air pillows, trains, tractor rides, plus a large indoor play barn with toddler play area.

Whatever the weather, there's always something fun happening throughout the day, with demonstrations, talks, animal handling and pig racing too, and all set in 80 acres of beautiful countryside. Some of the attractions are closed due to Covid procedures so do check before visiting. The park is located near Keynsham. Use postcode BS31 1TP.

APPs of the Week



Hopscotch is a free drag-and-drop coding app that helps kids learn coding. Hopscotch provides a scaffolding learning for coding. This app empowers the students to experiment and write their own code and programs in Hopscotch programming language.

'Monster Physics' is a unique building app that lets you play with physics! Build and operate your own car, crane, rocket ship, plane, helicopter, tank and more! It is more suited to upper KS2.

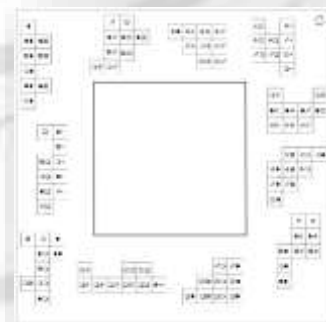
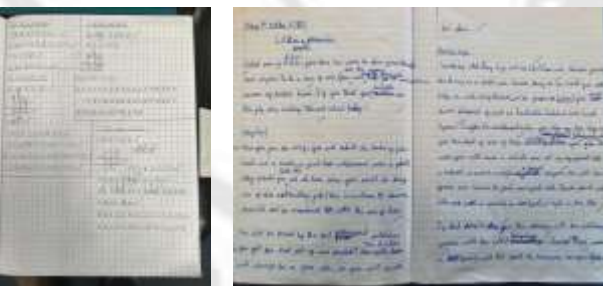
Year 6 Raffle Reminder
